MURRAY STREET, FINLEY RECONSTRUCTION PROJECT





INFORMATION FOR BUSINESSES AND RESIDENTS

Berrigan Shire Council and Transport for NSW are upgrading Murray Street, between Wollamai and Pinnuck Streets, to make it safer and easier for everyone to use. Transport for NSW will complete the road works which will then be followed by Berrigan Shire Council completing further upgrades to the pedestrian crossing, disability access and stormwater drainage. We appreciate your patience as we work to improve Murray Street for the whole community.

What are we doing?

- The road will be fully resurfaced with new paving.
- The existing pedestrian crossing will be relocated to mid block to improve safety.
- New kerbs and gutters will be built on the East side of the street.
- A smooth, concrete footpath will be laid down on the East side of the street.
- Clearly marked parking bays will be added in safe spots along the road.
- Ramps that meet disability access standards (DDA ramps) will be installed at crossings to make it easier for people with mobility needs.
- The stormwater drainage system will be upgraded.
- An AC water main will be replaced with a uPVC water main to improve water supply.
- New landscaping and greenery will be added to make the street more attractive.
- Road level tree surrounds will remain.

Why are we doing this project?

- The 1-kilometre section between Wollamai and Scoullar Streets is a busy commercial area, with around 6,000 vehicles passing through each day.
- The existing pedestrian crossing is being relocated to a safer position to better protect people crossing the road.
- The footpaths are uneven and are requiring an upgrade.
- The area is prone to flooding, and the road and parking surfaces are worn and in poor condition.
- New planter surrounds at road level will be installed to create tree islands, improving the appearance of the street and making traffic flow safer and more consistent.
- The stormwater drainage system will also be improved to help prevent water pooling along the roadside.

How will the project affect you?

We will work to keep disruptions to a minimum, but here's what to expect:

- The existing pedestrian crossing at the Pinnuck Street intersection will be moved about 50 metres to a safer location.
- This change will allow for more on-street parking near the intersection.
- The overall number of parking bays will not be reduced as a result of these works.
- Some driveways and access points may be temporarily affected during construction, but all areas will be restored—and in many cases improved —once work is complete.
- We expect to maintain access to businesses will be maintained at all times.
 We'll contact affected businesses directly and well in advance.
- There may be temporary parking changes on the East side of Murray Street during the Council's part of the project.
- Defours will be in place to manage traffic during Transport for NSW's roadworks.

Water Disruption

As part of the connection of the new untreated water main, it will be necessary to temporarily shut off the untreated water supply for a period of up to four hours during the day.

Affected residents and businesses will be notified well in advance via a letterbox drop.

Following the completion of the connection, we recommend running your tap briefly to flush out any discoloured water that may be present in the pipes.
